

Musicians in Schools

NZMC are delighted to announce that they have successfully negotiated new contracts with the Ministry of Education, running until December 2011.

The NZ Music Commission's 'Musicians Mentoring in Schools Programme' brings the 'magic' and inspiration of people - face to face, sharing their skills in recording, composition and performance, their knowledge and experience of the music industry, to students and teachers all over New Zealand. Few students will forget the lessons learnt the day a member of Nesian Mystic or Elemeno P comes to their school.

The NZ Music Commission sources, trains and supports high-profile musicians of the pop/rock genre and places them into schools in all parts of New Zealand. Students get to work on music projects with artists such as Don McGlashan, Ladi6, Rio Hemopo (Fat Freddys), Mike Fabulous (The Black Seeds), Victoria Girling-Butcher (Lucid 3), Hera, Jimmy Christmas (Luger Boa/The D4), Anna Coddington, Wayne Mason, Marcus Powell (Blindspott), Three Houses Down and Shona Laing to name only a few (and there are more than 100 on the database...).

Thousands of mentor visits have been made since late 2001. Musicians have mentored in schools from Taipa to Nightcaps, working with students in the year 7-13 age group, on song-writing, recording and performance aspects.

Many visits are planned this May including Tyna Keelan, Tama Waipara and Horomona Horo working in Northland Schools, Charlotte Yates, Iva Lamkum and Rio Hemopo in the Hawkes Bay, Flip Grater and **Nick Gaffaney** in the deep south.

Recent correspondence from the Ministry of Education claimed NZMC programmes were "an enormous success". Comments from participants confirm the wide range of social, industry and educational benefits gained.


NZMC are please to announce that the new contract also includes the *Smokefree Pacifica Beats Competition*.
